t's the Second Round Proper for the Fleet this afternoon, who have gone one better so far than in last season's competition. The big guns of the WSL and Women's Championship don't come in to the reckoning until the Fourth Round but with two tiers separating the teams this afternoon, the visit of Portsmouth is a big enough gun to be going on with for the Fleet Women!

There are plenty of goals in both sides – Portsmouth beat Fulham 9-0 in the previous round while the Fleet scored five each against Herne Bay and Oxford City and then three away from home against favourites Chesham United at the last stage.

There are plenty of similarities in results. Like the Fleet, Portsmouth have lost only once in the league this season but they came unstuck last week in their county cup at Bournemouth (as did the Fleet in county-cup competition at Chatham Town).

The Fleet exited last season's Women's FA Cup at home against another south coast side in Southampton – that one went to extratime despite the Saints' higher-division status and the aim will again be to push exalted opponents all the way and further.

There are plenty of goals in the Fleet side, with Amelia Woodgate and Amy Russ always good bets to get on the scoresheet but Logan O'Shea has scored in four of the last five games and is in great form too. Portsmouth's danger players include Welsh international Emma Jones while Beth Lumsden grabbed a hat-trick in the previous round of this competition to take her total to 14 in 2023/24.

Buckle up, there's an exciting 90 minutes ahead and then extratime and penalties if needs be!

02 Casey Iron

Former Billericay Town defender and sports science graduate. Previously with Tottenham Hotspur, she is a right-back who won the Division One South East title with Billericay. She signed for the Fleet in autumn 2022.

03 Millie Waud

A PE teacher in Medway, the versatile former Gillingham player signed for the Fleet in July 2022 and usually occupies a defensive berth. She has also represented Kent Ladies and won the Gills' young player of the year award in 2017/18.

04 Vicky Grieve

A new signing for the Fleet at the start of 2023, Vicky was captain of QPR Women. The Blackpool-born centre-back is composed on the ball and has been playing since the age of eight. She started out at Fleetwood Town, moving to Leicester City aged 11 where she stayed until a move south aged 18 with QPR. While at Fleet, she has also played for Kent.

05 Hannah Porter

Experienced Essex Ladies county central defender who has played for Colchester United, CGK Basildon, Harlow Town, Leyton Orient and Billericay Town. She signed for the London Bees in 2021 and moved on to Ebbsfleet at the start of the season.

06 Stef Simmons

Former Charlton Athletic and Crystal Palace defender or wide player who moved to the Fleet in October 2022. She has vast experience in the National League with her former clubs.

07 Logan O'Shea

Signed in November 2022 for the Fleet having previously played for Billericay Town where she won the Women's National League title. She has also represented Charlton Athletic. Logan has contributed goals since her arrival and is now past double figures for the club.

08 Charley Clifford

Working her way back to fitness after suffering a serious injury this season, Charley signed for the Fleet in January from Crystal Palace. She spent a decade with Charlton before moving to Palace in 2021 where she played in the Women's Championship. With Charlton, she became the club's record appearance holder after playing 272 times.

09 Amelia Woodgate

The Fleet's young player of the year in 2022/23 aged 16, the prolific Amelia has bagged 40 goals in her time with the Fleet since December 2022. She was previously with Charlton Athletic and Thanet and is definitely one to look out for in the future with a huge amount of goals to her name in junior football.

11 Lydia Wills

A product of Gillingham's academy who broke into senior women's football aged 16. The Kent county player later joined Thamesview and then Kent Football United. She moved from Gillingham in the summer of 2022. She is now into double figures for goals at the Fleet.

12 Madison Woodgate

Twin sister of Amelia but unlike her sibling, Madison is more concerned with stopping goals than scoring them (though she has scored plenty in her time as well). The defender is a former Charlton player who has represented Kent and was previously with Thanet.

13 Ash Naismith

The second keeper in the Fleet squad, Ash has trialled with Brighton and played for Kent Schools. Ash has turned out on loan for London Seaward and signed for the Fleet in the summer of 2022. Ash is a young player with lots of potential.

14 Teni Charles

Talented wide player who signed for the Fleet in February 2023. Teni was previously with QPR, with whom she also played as a junior, and Billericay where she won promotion. A Saint Vincent and the Grenadines international, she has spent time in the USA and the winger can also play in a more attacking midfield role.

15 Maddie Reynolds

Midfielder who previously played with her teammates Logan O'Shea and Teni Charles at Billericay Town. She was previously with Charlton Athletic. Maddie has overcome an injury-struck first year with the Fleet and has hit the 2023/24 season in good form.

16 Liv Jestin

A former Aylesford and Gillingham wide midfielder and another player who can count Kent Ladies representation on her CV. Signed from Brighouse Town in the summer of 2022 after returning from University.

17 Lily Hewitt

An U16 Kent Cup finalist with Bexley Grammar School, midfielder Lily was previously with Charlton Athletic. The young attacker signed for the Fleet in the summer of 2023 and has since spent time on loan at Sevenoaks Town.

18 Niamh O'Neill

Another former Charlton Athletic youth player, the versatile Kent Schools defender/midfielder has also represented England at youth level. Niamh has spent time on loan at Sevenoaks Town since signing in the summer of 2023.

20 Phoebe Murton Gillingham-born defender or midfielder who signed for the Fleet earlier this season from Hashtag United. She has previous experience with Sittingbourne, Phoenix Sports, London City Lionesses and Crawley Wasps.



21 Ellie George

Young player progressing from the girls' U16s who reached the Merit Cup Final with the Fleet last season. Ellie has signed on loan at Sevenoaks Town so far this season.





World Beach games. She has previously played for Southampton Saints and arrived at Portsmouth in the 2020/21 season.



VICE CAPTAIN: Ava Rowbotham

Midfielder who signed a new contract this summer, Ava joined Pompey on loan from Lewes in March 2020, but made the move permanent in the following summer. She has since appeared 75 times for the club and has scored seven goals. She was appointed vicecaptain at Portsmouth in the summer.



ONE TO WATCH: Emma Jones

A Welsh international striker who started out with Reading and played abroad with Oregon State Beavers at college and then in Sweden with Linkoping. She returned to play for Cardiff City Ladies and then Lewes, signing for Portsmouth in 2021. She made her internatonal debut in 2019.



Appointed: 11.2017 The head coach has more than 10 years of coaching experience, across various formats and he is a current UEFA A License holder. He began at Portsmouth seven vears ago as assistant manager, before progressing to the role of manager and this season was appointed on a full-time basis, combining football management with club operations and community engagement.

02 Nicole Barrett

Signed in July 2022 after leaving Maidenhead. An offensively minded right-back with a knack for scoring goals and a great crosser of the ball, she played 30 times last season.

03 Kelcı Bowers

A summer arrival who came to Portsmouth following her departure from Louisiana State University. A former Southampton youth, she joined Chelsea's academy, winning the WSL Academy title in 2021 and playing for England from U14–U19 level.

04 Leeta Rutherford

This is the third spell at the club for the industrious midfielder who returned in the summer after previously leaving in 2016. Since then she has played for Lewes, Crystal Palace and Southampton, winning the National League title with the Saints. She also won titles with Southampton in 2012 and 2015.

05 Evie Gane

The full-back played for Reading and Oxford United aged 16 before moving on to Aston Villa, AFC Wimbledon and London Bees. The former Welsh youth international signed for Portsmouth in 2021, also turning out for Watford and Coventry United before returning to Pompey for a second spell earlier this year.

06 Jazz Younger

The central defender joined Portsmouth in 2018 after leaving Brighton & Hove Albion, making her the longest-serving member of the squad. The player of the season has made 100 appearances for the club and she signed a new contract this summer.

10 Dani Lane

A tenacious midfielder who joined second-tier Lewes in 2014 and stayed six seasons in Sussex before signing for Portsmouth in 2021. An intelligent player with great vision and leadership qualities.

12 Sophie Quirk

A fast and dynamic winger who arrived in July 2022 after a season with Charlton in the second tier. A former Reading youth, Sophie moved on to London Bees and also played for England at U17 and U19 level. Last season she scored 16 goals in 32 appearances.

14 Annie Rolf

A Brighton youth graduate who played for the U21s before making first-team appearances from 2015-17. Annie went to America to study and play football and returned to the UK in December 2021, signing for Portsmouth a few months later. She is a brave midfielder with energy who covers plenty of ground.

16 Ella Humphrey

A Welsh U19 international who first signed on dual agreement from Brighton in October 2022. The versatile attack-minded player made the move permanent in the summer after playing 14 times for Pompey last season.

17 Georgie Freeland

The winger made the short move from Southampton in the summer and signed a two-year semi-professional deal. She scored 10 goals in 34 games to win the National League Southern Premier title with the Saints in 2021/22. She has natural pace, directness and a high level of technical ability.

20 Ella Wild

Young defender signed in 2022 from Reading. She was a regular in the Royals' academy team, making the bench for the firsttime on a number of occasions. She signed a new deal with Pompey in June.

21 Alı Hall

Forward brought in from Stoke City in January, where she'd spent the previous four years. A player with plenty of pedigree, having turned out for Coventry United and Aston Villa in the Championship, she has lots of leadership qualities in the dressing room. Last season she played 15 times, scoring four times.

23 Emily Pitman

Arrived in August from Arsenal's U21 side. The 18-year-old with big potential scored four goals in pre-season for Pompey after scoring twice for the Gunners academy team last season.

25 Izzy Collins

Another arrival from Lewes, the athletic and technical defender signed in 2022. Hailing from Norwich, she joined the Canaries' youth side and progressed through the ranks before her move to Lewes.

26 Beth Lumsden

Forward signed from Southampton in the summer. The 24-year-old was previously with Oxford United, scoring 27 goals in 33 appearances for the Yellows. She scored six times in three pre-season games for Pompey. A former Arsenal youth, she has also played for Chelsea, Millwall and Charlton.

27 Riva Casley

Oxford United's skipper signed for Pompey in July. She began her career with Oxford before moving on to play Championship football with Millwall and Charlton Athletic. She returned to Oxford in 2021 and was a huge impact on that club's title challenge last season, impressing as Oxford went head to head with Portsmouth, Watford and Ipswich for the top spot.

wo tiers higher, the leaders of the FA Women's National League - Southern Premier Division and won eight of their nine league matches.

It's not quite guaranteeting them promotion yet, however, as Hashtag United Women have an identical record and are indeed the only side to have beaten Pompey (1-0) this season.

Portsmouth can boast a much better goal difference, however, with a very impressive 40 goals scored against just two conceded and they have enjoyed an 11-0 cup win over Ashford Town, scored nine against Cardiff City and Fulham, eight at Chatham Town and seven each against Moneyfields and Billericay Town.

Jay Sadler's side finished fourth in the league last season, just six points behind champions Watford and not far behind Ipwich and Oxford United either.

Portsmouth – who currently play at Havant & Waterlooville's Westleigh Park – have previously won this division in both 2012 and 2015 and they spent the 2013/14 season in the National Division of the Women's Premier League (then tier two).

INIVERS

The club was formed in 1987 when women's football was in its



infancy. They started out in the Southern Region League, gaining promotion to the South West Combination League in 1998 to begin their rise to the present level. In 2005 they became only the second women's club in Britain to establish a Football Academy for females.

In the summer, the Women's first-team moved to a semi-professional setup, with head coach Jay Sadler commenting, "Our vision is to compete at the highest level possible and this support will provide a solid foundation to achieve that."

Jess Smith, currently on loan to Dorking, is one of the club's homegrown academy talents
